

The Birds of the Shropshire Ffridd

Training workshop to encourage the recording of some key hillside birds



The ffridd is a Welsh term for scrub and heath covered hillsides. These hillsides are a valuable wildlife habitat that relies upon light grazing. They are home to a variety of birds that are becoming increasingly scarce in the countryside.

The Stepping Stones project would like to understand the importance of this habitat around the Long Mynd and the Stiperstones. It would like your help in monitoring some of the key birds associated with the ffridd.



Training workshops will be carried out in the field for any one interested in helping with this monitoring work, on **Friday the 2nd May or Sunday 4th May , 9am to 12noon.**

This will concentrate on three species, tree pipit, cuckoo and stonechat. No experience necessary, but ability to use mobile phone apps useful.
